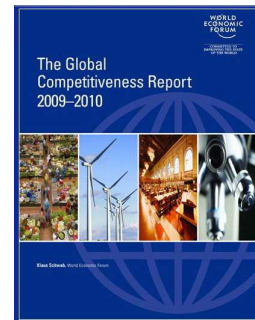

The OHRID Institute for Economic Strategies and International Affairs has the honor to announce that the economy of Republic of Macedonia has improved its score in the list of the World Economic Forum and became more competitive.

Namely, Republic of Macedonia has improved its rating, placing at the 84th spot out of 133 countries at the comparative list of most competitive economies in 2009-2010, done by World Economic Forum.



Republic of Macedonia has index of 3.95 on the comparative list of the most competitive economies for 2009-2010. Republic of Macedonia has improved the place comparing to last year which was 89th.

Of the other Balkan states, Montenegro is at 62, Croatia at 72, Macedonia is at 84 on the list, Serbia at 93, Albania at 96 and Bosnia and Herzegovina trails at 109.

The report calculates the rankings using publicly available data and a survey of 13,000 business leaders across 133 economies. European economies dominate the top spots, with Sweden, Denmark, Finland, Germany and the Netherlands also appearing in the top 10.
